GEOG 105 INTRO TO CULTURAL GEOGRAPHY (3 Hours)

Knowledge of the basic concepts characterizing each culture with emphasis on past population and global problems; patterns and spatial aspects of fertility and mortality; migration; social customs on the landscape; and urban patterns. Students are required to do two cultural field based projects.

GEOG 209 WORLD REGIONAL GEOGRAPHY (3 Hours)

Study of the different geographical regions of the world consisting of early settlement; people and economic development; physical environment; resources; and future. This class is a lecture-lab. Students are required to do lab activities in class, the library, and community field based as well.
